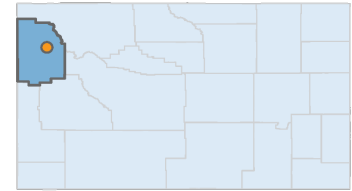


Teton

Teton is a county in Wyoming with 3,481 residents age 65 or older. There are approximately 26 Native American residents age 55 or older. Compared to state average rates, older residents in Teton County are more likely to have a graduate or professional degree. The most prevalent chronic conditions among people age 65+ in Teton County are hypertension (34%), arthritis (29%), and high cholesterol (27%). They are non-smokers and more likely to take the health promotion steps of doing any physical activity within the past month, meeting the CDC guidelines for both muscle-strengthening and aerobic physical activity, eating 5 or more servings of fruits and vegetables per day, and having an annual dental exam. However, they are less likely to take the preventive health measure of having a pneumonia vaccine and they have a higher than state rate of excessive drinking. Community resources to support healthy aging include 91% with a regular doctor, a hospital, a home health agency, a nursing home, a senior center, and a hospice agency.

TECHNICAL NOTES

**See our technical report for more detailed information on data sources, measures, and methodology. For most indicators the county and state values are estimates derived from sample data. Thus, it is possible that some of the differences between state and county estimates may be due to chance associated with population sampling. We use the terms “Better” and “Worse” to highlight differences between county and state estimates that we are confident are not due to chance. “Better” is used where a higher/lower value has positive implications for the health of older residents. “Worse” is used where a higher/lower score has negative implications for the health of older people, and when the implication is unclear, we use an *. We balance two goals. First, we aim to report data at very local levels because we believe change is often locally driven. Second, we vowed to protect the privacy of the people providing the information reported. Thus, given the constraints of the data analyzed we used a hierarchical approach to reporting.*
