

## Bridgeport Area3 (Fairfield)

Bridgeport Area 3 is a Western neighborhood of Bridgeport in Fairfield County with 4,868 residents age 65 or older. Compared to state average rates, older residents had lower rates of hip fracture, atrial fibrillation, benign prostatic hyperplasia, breast cancer, cataract, fibromyalgia, leukemias and lymphomas, osteoarthritis/rheumatoid arthritis, and hearing impairment. However, they had higher rates of tooth loss, obesity, Alzheimer's disease, anemia, asthma, chronic kidney disease, CHF, diabetes, epilepsy, hypertension, ischemic heart disease, liver disease, peripheral vascular disease, pressure ulcers, stroke, substance/tobacco use disorders, bipolar disorder, schizophrenia, and mobility impairment. They are less likely to take the health promotion steps of getting the recommended hours of sleep, doing physical activity, meeting the CDC guidelines for aerobic physical activity, getting flu/pneumonia/shingles vaccines, getting colorectal cancer/cholesterol screenings, an annual dental exam, and meeting CDC preventative health screening goals. They are also more likely to be stressed about buying food and not see a doctor due to cost. Community resources to support healthy aging include 62 primary care providers and 2 hospitals within 5 miles; 8 hospice agencies, 5 community health centers, 3 public libraries, and 2 senior centers.

#### TECHNICAL NOTES

\*See our technical report (online at <https://healthyagingdatareports.org>) for more information on data sources, measures, geographic units, margins of error, and statistical methodology. For most indicators the community and state values are estimates derived from sample data. Thus, it is possible that some of the differences between state and community estimates may be due to chance associated with population sampling. We use the terms "Better" and "Worse" to highlight differences between community and state estimates that we are confident are not due to chance. "Better" is used where a higher/lower value has positive implications for the health of older residents. "Worse" is used where a higher/lower score has negative implications for the health of older people, and when the implication is unclear, we use an \*.

We balance two goals. First, we aim to report data at very local levels because we believe change is often locally driven. Second, we vowed to protect the privacy of the people providing the information reported. Thus, given the constraints of the data analyzed we used a hierarchical approach to reporting.
