A2 Hartford (Hartford)

Hartford Area 2 is a Central neighborhood of Hartford in Hartford County with 2,891 residents aged 65 and older. Compared to state average rates, older adults have lower rates of atrial fibrillation, endometrial cancer, fibromyalgia/chronic pain/fatigue, and osteoarthritis/rheumatoid arthritis. However, they have higher rates of Alzheimer's disease, anemia, asthma, chronic kidney disease, congestive heart failure (CHF), diabetes, ischemic heart disease, liver disease, osteoporosis, peripheral vascular disease, pressure ulcer, stroke, substance use disorder, depression, anxiety disorder, PTSD, and schizophrenia. Older residents in Hartford County varied in obtaining preventive health screenings: residents 18 and older got annual physical exams (77.9%) and annual dental exams (69.2%), while 46.5% of men and 47.1% of women 65 and older completed all CDC recommended vaccinations and cancer screenings. Community resources include three assisted living facilities, 100 primary care providers, two community health centers, three adult day health centers, four public universities or community colleges, and one public library.

TECHNICAL NOTES

*For more information on data sources, measures, and methodology used in the 2025 Connecticut Healthy Aging Data Report see our technical documentation at (healthyagingdatareports.org). For most indicators, the community and state values are estimates derived from sample data. Thus, it is possible that some of the differences between state and community estimates may be due to chance associated with population sampling. We use the terms "Better" and "Worse" to highlight differences between community and state estimates that we are confident are not due to chance. We balance two goals. First, we aim to report data at very local levels because we believe change is often locally driven. Second, we vowed to protect the privacy of the people providing the information reported. Thus, given the constraints of the data analyzed, we used a hierarchical approach to reporting.
