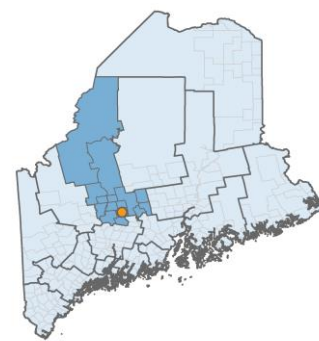


## Skowhegan (Somerset)

Skowhegan is a town in Somerset County with 2,343 residents aged 65 and older. Compared to average rates, older residents have a lower rate of endometrial cancer. However, they have higher rates of high cholesterol, cataract, chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD), congestive heart failure (CHF), diabetes, heart attack, hypertension, ischemic heart disease, peripheral vascular disease, pressure ulcer, and tobacco use disorder. Older residents in Somerset County varied in obtaining preventive health screenings: residents 18 and older got annual physical exams (77.6%) and annual dental exams (57.5%), while 39.3% of men and 43.5% of women 65 and older completed all CDC recommended vaccinations and cancer screenings. Community resources to support healthy aging include four primary care providers, one hospital, two skilled nursing facilities, one adult day health center, and a public library. Skowhegan is a designated AARP Age-Friendly Community.

## TECHNICAL NOTES

\*For more information on data sources, measures, and methodology used in the 2025 Maine Healthy Aging Data Report see our technical documentation at ([healthyagingdatareports.org](https://healthyagingdatareports.org)). For most indicators, the community and state values are estimates derived from sample data. Thus, it is possible that some of the differences between state and community estimates may be due to chance associated with population sampling. We use the terms “Better” and “Worse” to highlight differences between community and state estimates that we are confident are not due to chance. We balance two goals. First, we aim to report data at very local levels because we believe change is often locally driven. Second, we vowed to protect the privacy of the people providing the information reported. Thus, given the constraints of the data analyzed, we used a hierarchical approach to reporting.
